For job-seekers with disabilities, finding work opportunities to live a meaningful and independent life are a greater challenge than for those without disabilities. Nearly half of 25-year-olds with autism have never held a paying job and 85% of college grads affected by autism are unemployed, compared to the national unemployment rate of 4.5%.

Evolve Coaching responds to this gap in services by providing Pittsburgh's adult Autism community with coaching support to build strengths in the areas of social awareness, self-advocacy, and executive function, enabling them to lead more independent lifestyles and become productive, integrated members of the community.

WHAT WE DO

JOB SHADOWING

For individuals ages 17-21. The purpose of this experience is to allow a student to get a realistic idea of what a job would entail by observing a staff member performing the duties of the role, the tasks necessary for the job, and get some hands on experience doing small tasks if appropriate.

WORK BASED LEARNING EXPERIENCE

For individuals ages 17-21. The purpose of this type of experience is to give a student a more hands on role in determining if a specific job is a good fit for them. This is typically for students who know what type of job they would like to have. A way to "try it out" before applying for a full or part time position.

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT

For individuals 18+. The purpose of this service is to assist job seekers in finding and securing competitive employment. Job coaches are available to assist job seekers and employers in determining appropriate accommodations, assisting in learning tasks necessary for the job, and fading support when no longer necessary.
