RE: **PA Chamber memo: Oppose H.B. 1925 - Healthcare AI**

On behalf of the Pennsylvania Chamber of Business and Industry, I am writing to respectfully urge you to oppose H.B. 1925 which we understand may be considered before the committee this week.

We appreciate the sponsor's willingness to engage stakeholders and are grateful for the thoughtful efforts made to improve this legislation. We value that collaboration and look forward to continuing these conversations. However, H.B. 1925 is not yet where it needs to be.

H.B. 1925 would create an industry-specific, state-specific artificial intelligence framework across the healthcare ecosystem, adding disclosure mandates, compliance obligations, reporting requirements, and record retention standards for sectors already heavily regulated under existing state and federal law. This approach risks creating duplicative compliance burdens, higher costs, and operational complexity.

The bill also raises serious enforcement concerns by combining oversight from state departments with penalties under Pennsylvania's Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Law. This penalty structure would subject employers to overlapping enforcement, duplicative penalties, private rights of action, and treble damages, significantly increasing legal exposure and uncertainty.

The Pennsylvania Chamber supports thoughtful conversations around the responsible use of AI but believes this legislation requires further refinement to avoid unnecessary burdens on employers. We look forward to continuing to work with the sponsor and stakeholders to improve HB 1925, but at this time, we respectfully urge a no vote.
