RE: **PA Chamber memo: Oppose H.B. 2632 - EITC Overhaul**

On behalf of the Pennsylvania Chamber of Business and Industry, I write to express our opposition to H.B. 2632.

For more than two decades, Pennsylvania's Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) and Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC) programs have represented one of the Commonwealth's most successful public-private partnerships. These programs have enabled businesses to voluntarily support scholarships and innovative educational opportunities while helping tens of thousands of students access schools and programs that best meet their needs.

H.B. 2632 would terminate the authority to issue tax credits under the existing EITC and OSTC programs beginning in fiscal year 2027-28 and replace them with a new Education Options Tax Credit framework. In doing so, the bill would impose numerous new restrictions, reporting requirements, and administrative mandates on scholarship organizations and participating schools, upending a proven framework that has expanded educational opportunity for thousands of students.

These programs have enabled thousands of students to access schools and learning environments that best meet their individual needs. Replacing this successful model with a more restrictive and burdensome system creates uncertainty and risks disrupting opportunities for the students and families who have come to rely on these programs.

At a time when demand for scholarships far exceeds available allotments, policymakers should focus on strengthening and expanding proven programs rather than dismantling them. The current EITC and OSTC programs have a long track record of success and continue to provide valuable educational opportunities for students across Pennsylvania.
